

## Snippets from Recent Club Programs

# September 26 -- Dr. Karen McKinnon (UCAR), "Research on Predicting Heat Waves in Eastern U.S."

Dr. McKinnon (Harvard graduate with M.S. and PhD, and currently doing post-PHD research at CU's Center for Academic Research) talked about her research activities focused on predicting summer heat waves in the eastern half of the U.S. based on large-scale sea-surface temperature patterns in the Pacific Ocean (referred to as "Pacific Extreme Patterns" or "PEPs". The general conclusions from this research is that there is only an average 15-percent accuracy for making such predictions, but there is better accuracy in predicting when a heat wave is <u>likely</u> to happen during the next 3-4 weeks. The reason why this research would be useful is when the prediction



model warns of very high temperature approaching 100F, it would help farmers to avoid corn crop damage is the Midwest, and help prevent heat-related deaths for up to seven percent of the overall population. The weather-prediction model was built using temperature data from 1992-2012 provided by over 4000 weather stations in the U.S. The model would have predicted the very hot summer of 2012 in the Midwest based on the PEP data for that year.
