

Snippets from Recent Club Programs

May 23 - Kerry Hassler, Tabitha Enabling Academy School (Nagalaad)

Foothills Kiwanis member Kerry Hassler talked about his February 11-16, 2016 visit to the English-speaking state of Nagaland, India to provide "Good Samaritan Technologies" non-profit technical support for the Tabitha Enabling Academy school for specialneeds children in Kohima, This Christian school started in 2012 by co-Directors Asanuo Seb and Ati Vese (shown in the photo with Kerry and TEA teacher Asha) has 30 students from ages 6-16



who receive education and/or physical rehabilitation in Monday-Friday that is not provided by the India government in public schools. Classes begin every day with singing Christian songs and recital of Bible verses learned by students. TEA teachers use signing to communicate and teach deaf students. The school is supported by donations from a local military unit (the Assam Rifles) and individual donations. Nagaland is located on the east side of India next to Myanmar, and is about the same size as Maryland with a population of 2 million. It is 80 percent Christian, with a majority of these Baptist. Due to a technical issue, Kerry was unable to show slides of Nagaland, but will do so on June 20. May 23 - Presentation by Mackintosh Academy Students

During the first part of our May 23 club meeting, students from the Mackintosh Academy gave a presentation about their school and the projects they are involved in there. Among their ideas for service have been fund-raising for the World Wildlife Fund and decreasing their school's carbon footprint. The schools overall plan is to improve its community facilities and systems so that students have a voice in the future of the school. Mackintosh Academy is an



independent K-8 school located in the former monastery on South Boulder Road in Boulder. Staff member Charlie Warren has been working with our Foothills Kiwanis Board to establish a Kiwanis Builders Club at the school to encourage the students doing community-service projects.
