### Snippets from Recent Club Programs

#### June 19 – Beryl Durazo, Firehouse Art Center

Beryl Durazo, Executive Director of Firehouse Art Center, highlighted the many ways in which the lives of underserved young people are being impacted by the ministry of art. Teacher Mario does art lessons once per week with teens and once per week with children. She teaches them how to use spray paint art in a constructive way. Beryl explained that Firehouse is making progress in identifying places where spray paint art enriches the community. For example, murals for blank walls and art on electrical boxes! She stated that the Colorado State's Creative Industry provides grants to those who enrich their community's



appearance with art expressions. Firehouse staff members teach children sculpting and chalk art. The Spanish-speaking children increase their verbal English skills as they socialize together. Firehouse Art Center has been in operation for 31 years. They have an average of 25 students but hope to increase to 40. They served 267 children last year. In terms of needs, Beryl mentioned that they have a large "viewing" audience, but need to develop their "buying" community to support the costs of the programs, for example, paint, brushes, etc.

#### June 26 – Margo Josephs, Boulder Parks & Recreation, TreeOpp

Margo, Project Director with the Parks Department, told us about a 2015 Knight Foundation funded program, TreeOpp, received by three entities in Boulder. In partnership with the City of Boulder and BLDG 61 Makerspace at the Boulder Public Library, participants in Bridge House's Ready to Work program receive expert training to turn Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) - infested wood debris into crafts, furniture and functional products for purchase by area residents. Margo explained the city's problem with EAB that is infesting 6,000 public and 70,000 private property trees in Boulder. She informed us that 5-8 members of Bridge House have been trained in a



3-month long apprentice program at the Library Makerspace under the direction of two experienced woodworkers. Milled ash wood is available at the ReSource Center, and finished products can be purchased at the Farmer's Market.
