



Snippets from Recent Club Programs

April 25 – Gene Tomczak, The USO (United Service Organizations)

Gene talked to us about the services provided to our active military personnel and family members by the USO, locally at DIA through a facility in Concourse A at the end of the pedestrian bridge to the Main Terminal. The facility has a snack and coffee bar, vidoo games, TVs, PCs for Internet access, and areas for reading, quiet-time, and kids. It's open every day from 6:00 a.m.-10:00 p.m. by a staff of mostly volunteers.



The USO operates 122 centers around the world, including 73 in the continental United States. This

non-profit was started in 1940 as the U.S. entered World War II through the combined resources of the YMCA, YWCA, National Catholic Community Service, the National Jewish Welfare Board, the Traveler's Aid Association, and the Salvation Army. They continue their long record of entertaining our troops with top performers, currently in Iraq, Afghanistan, and other places.

May 2 — Becky Campbell-Howe, "Colorado Youth Program"

Becky, newly appointed Colorado Youth Program Executive Director, spoke to our club about a program that connects all kids to nature, their communities, and their inner strength though year-round recreation and service. Becky, a Boulder native, has 25 years of non-profit experience along with work experience at NCAR and American Solar Energy. Since opening its doors in 1995, CYP has served more than a thousand youth from diverse backgrounds. Through CYP's two main programs, Summer Camp and Adventure Club,



youth ages 11-18 are connected to nature through recreation, education, and service. CYP believes that all kids should have these opportunities; therefore, 70 percent of CYP youth qualify for reduced tuition rates to attend these programs thanks to the generous support of individuals, foundations, and corporations.
