

Erika spoke to our club about Intercambio. She has been with Intercambio as grants manager since 2015. She holds a Master of Public Administration degree from the Evans School at the University of Washington. She has worked with other organizations in the Boulder/Denver area including the urgent action fund for Women's Human Rights, Global Greengrants Fund, and Judi's House. She explained that Intercambio Uniting Communities is a nonprofit that is dedicated to improving immigrant lives through English education, and uniting communities across cultures. It uses the power of language learning to connect divided communities. They train volunteers to
