

Pepper, who has been with her since a pup of 8 weeks, knows 40 commands to help Morgan with her disease. Morgan and Pepper demonstrated some the commands; some important ones are: alerts Morgan and family if blood sugar is low and finds items needed to check blood level. Pepper is now two years old, and is Morgan's best friend. Morgan understands that she must take good care of Pepper when at places such as school. She



must make sure that Pepper is safe with food, water, and bathroom breaks. On June 30, Morgan and Pepper will attend graduation ceremonies at Al Boeve's home. 
