



Snippets from Recent Club Programs

February 6 – Sabra Jewell, I Love U Guys Foundation

Sabra, Development Director of "I love u guys Foundation" (ILUGF) spoke about how this organization was started, its mission, and what the organization is currently doing within our communities. ILUGF, unfortunately, was founded as result of a school tragedy within our backyard, Bailey, CO. In late 2006, a lone gunman entered the Platte Canyon HS in Bailey and held hostage 7 girls of which one was killed, Emily Keyes. Before being killed, Emily texted her parents "I love u guys. K?" As a result of losing their child, Ellen & John-Michael Keyes (parents) began leveraging



their corporate skills to spearhead children safety discussions with experts in education, law enforcement, emergency management and psychologists to protect children in school. These efforts resulted in the founding of this foundation in late 2006. Two of the foundation's notable products are: the SRPs (Standard Response Protocol) & SRMs (Standard Reunification Method); the SRP was introduced to schools and first responders in 2009 and is commonly known as the Lockout, Lockdown, Evacuate & Shelter scenarios/actions. These training tools are now within 16,000 schools across North America and over 492K teachers and administrators and 50K Police Officers are now trained on these protocols. The protocols are free to any school, district, department, agency or organization and are downloadable from ILUGF's website. February 13 – Lea Anne Paskvalich, Temple Grandin School

Lea Anne, Director of Public Relations, spoke to our members about the Temple Grandin School - a five-year old school that serves students with Asperger's and similar learning profiles. Lea Anne has lived in Boulder since 1998, and got involved in an early intervention with her young son who showed signs of autism. The school provides a supportive, socially engaging educational community for bright students with autism spectrum disorder to recognize and realize their potential. It has a full academic program delivered by highly-qualified content specialist teachers. The staffstudent ratio is 1:3 with class sizes of 4-8 students. Thanks, Lea Anne, for an interesting program.

Please reserve Saturday, May 6, 2017 from 1-4 PM for our famous Taste of Boulder (TOB) fundraiser. For those not familiar with TOB, it is one of our major fundraisers. It also helps raise the profile of the Club and is an enjoyable experience for Club members and their friends. In short, we recruit 12-15 restaurants near or on Pearl Street to provide small (and sometimes more than small) samplings of their food to holders of tickets to TOB that the Club sells. The price has been \$15 for many years, except for the partnership with the Boulder Valley Girls Softball organization (BVGS) described below. Pete Sprenkle originated and led the project many years ago and is still helping where he can. It is also a major fundraiser for BVGS, who buys the tickets from the Club for \$5 and sells them for \$15. Joe Girard took on the task last year. Rich Plumridge has agreed to lead the effort this year. Joe and Audrey Girard have graciously agreed to help with the process, particularly the substantial IT, mailing and other operational requirements. The TOB also requires a substantial commitment from a number of Club members to help follow up with calls to the restaurants to induce them to participate. The membership has always been very supportive traditionally. Rich will be calling soon to request the necessary help. As requested, he will endeavor to assign restaurants to those caller volunteers who have called them in the past.
