

Snippets from Recent Club Programs

November 7 – Brian Wheat, Evolution of a Fruit Stand: Lafayette Florist

Brian started his talk by giving a summary of his life, starting with growing up in central Illinois on a horse farm, finding he had a natural ability to draw in middle-school, and becoming the illustrator for a newspaper at 14. Just like his father, he did amateur boxing and had an excellent record. After attending college for a year, in 1980 he enlisted in the Air Force and did illustrations as part of Strategic Air Command assignment, leading to his being named "SAC Airman of the Year" in 1984. Brian met his future wife Lori in Ft. Collins, the granddaughter of Yasutaro and Kumiko (Kate) Yoshihara who in 1945 started a small fruit stand in Lafayette next to a flower shop



that they merged into the same company. In 1960, Lori's parents Gene and Evelyn Yoshihara took over the business and expanded it to become today's Lafayette Florist company. Brian left the Air Force in 1984 to work for Lafayette Florist, becoming a member of the Yoshihara family with his marriage to Lori, and now serving as CEO of the business (Lori is the Director of Merchandise and Marketing). Lafayette Florist is a major producer of cut flowers, garden plants, and vegetables at their location of 600 South Public Road in Lafayette. For more info, see -- www.lafayetteflorist.com.

November 14 – Steve Hinson, "Flatirons Habitat for Humanity Update"

Flatirons Habitat for Humanity (FHFH) Development Director Steve Hinson gave an update on FHFH projects in Boulder County and surrounding areas. FHFH was started in 1992, and to date has provided 80 homes in Boulder County for low-income families. Another 100 low-income family homes in Guatemala have been constructed through a FHFH partnership with Habitat for Humanity International. The current FHFH project in north Boulder (Wonderland Creek) is targeted for completion in March, 2017, which will house three families and a single disabled veteran. Another FHFH project nearing completion in January is rebuilding a home in Jamestown destroyed by



the 2013 flooding in that area. The next major FHFH project is "King's Ridge" at 47th and Valmont, which will have a four-plex of 3-story family units (one apartment, two 2-bedroom, and two 3-bedroom). As is true for all FHFH homes, mortgages for occupants will have a 0-percent interest-rate with 225 hours of sweat-equity required for each home-owner. Also, future FHFH projects include a 19-unit home site near FHFH's current Violet Hollow site, consisting of four buildings to be built from 2018-2022. Other upcoming projects include a low-income home-site along South Boulder Road in Louisville starting in 2019, as well as a low-income home-site in Broomfield.
