

June 17 - Bill Obermeier, Boulder Dairy Center for the Arts

Modern issues in society required modern creative thinking, according to Mr. Obermeier; and arts are the incubator of creativity. His vision is to give the Boulder community a more defined reputation as a leader of the arts in the West. The Dairy Center of Boulder reaches out to teens, immigrants, and the community as a whole to foster creative, imaginative, flexible, and innovative endeavors. These are qualities consistent with leadership in the United States. Despite Boulder's reputation as being a leader in supporting the arts, we are actually at the lowest level of support



for the arts in Colorado. Bill Obermeier would like to change this starting with a new \$3.4M capital campaign for the Dairy Center. He hopes to renovate the existing facilities and provide more opportunities for artists to thrive in Boulder. What a wonderful opportunity for Boulder to live up to its reputation!

June 24 – Grant Simon, "Crayons to Calculators" School Supplies

Grant Simon is a recent graduate of CU Boulder and has recently returned from a study abroad program in Jordan. He now works for a local charity that compiles school supplies into backpacks for needy children. He has been working with Crayons to calculators (C2C) since 2007 to provide supplies to the Boulder Valley School District. In 2012, C2C delivered more



than 8,000 backpacks to children in the Boulder area. C2C is part of a larger charity "Impact on Education", whose mission is to assist children from preschool to grade 12 with the tools they need to achieve success in school. This summer he will be stuffing backpacks at the Boulder education center on 65th and Arapahoe. Partially sponsored by Western Disposal, this year he hopes to provide 9,000 backpacks. June 5 Foothills Donations Committee Meeting Notes -- Kerry Hassler

<u>Attendees:</u> Adam Pauluhn, Allison DeYoung, Jerry Gilland, and Kerry Hassler with Gary Symes absent (Guests: Paul Bailey, Jim Creasey, Ralph Wappel) <u>Location:</u> Higgins & DeYoung Wealth Strategies in Boulder (<u>Meeting Notes:</u>

- Jerry started the meeting with a financial summary of our current Foothills Foundation funds not including the former Boulder Kiwanis Club's investment account transferred to our club. His report showed that if we used all of these excess funds for outstanding Foundation donation requests (especially for a \$7500 donation to Amistad), all of our excess Foothills Foundation funds would be depleted this club year.
- Kerry noted that the April 9 Donations Committee recommendation to the Foundation Board of distributing June 10 benefit tourney funds (i.e., \$4500 to Attention Homes, \$2000 to our Service Dog Academy, and \$3500 to KI EIMINATE) has not bee approved during the May Foundation Board meeting. Adam will bring this recommendation to the Foundation Board during its June 6 meeting.

Disposition of outstanding Donations Committee requests:

1. <u>Donation Request:</u> Paul Bailey made Foothills Foundation request in support of March 3, 2013 Foothills Kiwanis Stars of

Tomorrow winner Isaac Allen Adam subsequently proposed \$1000 Foundation donation from our excess Foundation funds on May 23; agreement by Kerry on May 24. <u>Committee Action</u>: After feedback provided by guest Paul Bailey, Donations Committee members agreed to support in principle a \$1000 donation to Isaac if we have sufficient Foundation funds to do this. We will try to schedule Isaac for a club meeting sometime in September.

2. Donation Request: Possible \$7500 donation to the Boulder Amistad organization to support minority youth through athletics and other programs (contact: Jim Creasey). From May 15 meeting notes, the Donation Committee needed to get an accounting of how Amistad has been supported in the past before we can go ahead with funding this project. Committee Action: With feedback provided by Jim Creasey and Ralph Waddle, the Committee learned that before the Boulder Kiwanis Club disbanded last year, it set a \$140,000 endowment to support FC Boulder in Boulder; and also in late 2012, Boulder Kiwanis set up an agreement with Amistad to give them donations for two years of \$10,000 each year. This resulted in \$10,000 being donated to them in 2012, but the second \$10,000 was not paid out when the Boulder Kiwanis Club disbanded in late 2012. Earlier this year, Ralph reduced the request for the second year \$10,000 donation to \$7,500. With this understanding, and also with Jim confirming the \$70,000 is **not** an endowment restricted to any particular purpose, Donation Committee members agreed this \$7500 donation promised to Amistad should be honored by our club, using some of the \$70,000 in investment funds transferred to our club from the Boulder Kiwanis Club. Consequently, Adam will make a request to Jerry Gilland to contact Gary Jaycox (manager of the transferred Boulder Kiwanis investment fund) to liquidate \$7500 of our club's \$70,000 investment fund, and send the check to Amistad directly or though Jerry. This closes this donation request to Foothills Kiwanis.

<u>3. Donation Request:</u> From Lionel to support horse-riding therapy program to replace a recurring \$500 donation to this organization that was formerly funded by the Boulder Kiwanis Club Foundations budget.

<u>Committee Action</u>: Donation Committee agreed that no Foothills Foundation funds will be used for this request since the champion for this project (Lionel) is joining the Longmont Kiwanis club. Jim confirmed that there are <u>no funds</u> in the \$70,000 investment account our club now has that was committed by the Boulder Kiwanis Club to fund this project. This closes this donation request to our club.

4. Donation Requests:

Payment of" Nuts and Bolts" license-plate hardware associated with this Boulder Kiwanis Club fundraiser (now "owned" by the Golden Nuggets Club).

<u>Committee Action</u>: The bill was bound to be a redundant bill that Adam confirmed has been paid by the Golden Nuggets Kiwanis Club. This closes this donation request to our club.

5. New Foundation donation requests

\$200 request from Allison DeYoung to Steve Higgins in support of the Global Hope Network International organization he spoke about during our June 3 Foothills meeting. This was approved by the Donation Committee.
