Snippets from Recent Club Programs

4/8/19 – Fred Forman, Smart Phone User Tips

Dr. Forman has undergraduate and two advanced degrees in Physics from Case Institute of Technology and University of Pennsylvania. He has over 35 years of experience in Information Technology, 30 years of which are as a senior executive in a large international consulting firm. He provided a brief overview of smartphone basics – apps, settings, security – and then briefly reviewed some of the most useful apps (health, email, maps, and social media). Some of the helpful tips that he provided included: photos and videos take a large amount of storage (be careful



not to inadvertently use burst mode); make your passwords strong (suggested use of security manager such as Dash Lane); use automatic setting for phone upgrades; group apps into families of a similar nature; Google iPhone emergency contact info; and use wifi whenever possible to minimize data usage. 4/15/19 – Kay Neckel, AARP Driver Safety

Kay is an instructor for the AARP Smart Drive Program. She has been a program instructor for eight years in Colorado area that includes everything north of Denver. Kay resides in Loveland, and is a native Coloradoan growing up in Denver and Lakewood. She is retired from the telephone company (now Century Link) as a supervisor of telephone operators. Besides safe driving tips, she talked about the time when folks can no longer safely drive and what other transportation alternatives are available. She informed us that there are 33,000 fatalities annually, and that most accidents happen by distracted drivers. People account for 90% of accidents. Distractions come from radios.



passenger conversations, GPS use, and texting/making phone calls while driving. She encouraged us to take the driving program test (\$15 cost); however, the law requires a discount in your car insurance premium. Kay took us through several examples of new state laws.
