

### Snippets from Recent Club Programs

#### January 6 – JosMarie Vanderspeck, "Living under Nazi Occupation in the Netherlands"

JosMarie spoke to our club about the severe challenges and difficult times living in the Netherloands during its occupation by Natzi troops from May 10, 1940 through the September, 1945. She was born in Roermond, and was age 9 when World War II started in 1939. She told of how her family was forced to open their home to occupying German milirary staff, rquireing them to live in only a few rooms. Food was scarce during this time, and on one occasion pigs was illegally given to her family by a local farmer. She was witness to the Dutch Underground helping to save Jews from deportation to concentration acmes, and her neighbors protecting Allied pilots who were shot down in dog-fights with



German planes. In the fall of 1944, Roermond was evacuated so that the Germans could set booby traps against Allied forces. Her family were able to return home after the war had ended. JosMarie suggested several books to read about World War II in Europe, including "In the Garden of Beasts" (Erik Larson), "The Boy in the Striped Pajamas" (John Boyne), and "Sarah's Key" (Tatiana de Rosnay).

#### January 13 - Eric Bauer, Rocky Mountain Colorado Ice Wizards for Kids

Eric spoke to our club about the Colorado Ice Wizards non-profit that provivdes an opportunity for special-needs kids to play hockey in a specially-adapted learning environment. The Ice Wizards are comprised of players ages five to adult, across a wide range of abilities from advanced to learn-to-skate. The emphasis is on skill development, sportsmanship and fun. The Ice Wizards also emphasize character building, responsibility and communication skills both on and off the



ice. The hockey games are non-contact with adapted rules, and are held at the YMCA ice rink in Lafayette. Colorado Ice Wizard players also have the opportunity of participating in the annual Special Hockey International tournament and other tournaments. These tournaments are a great opportunity for players and their families to meet hockey players from other special needs teams.
